God Explains Truth with Truth

In your Bible: A **cross reference** is a note placed alongside the **biblical** text which directs the reader to another place in the **Bible** to elaborate on a point. It gives only the book, chapter, and verse without any comment.


GODcha Offers 2 Ways to Search Cross References.

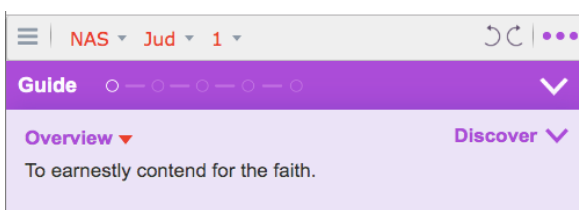
1. In GODcha: The  **Road Sign** will give you other Scripture References, **cross references, aka, CR**, that deal with **Key Words** and/or **topics** you are searching out.

Tap the reference to Open.

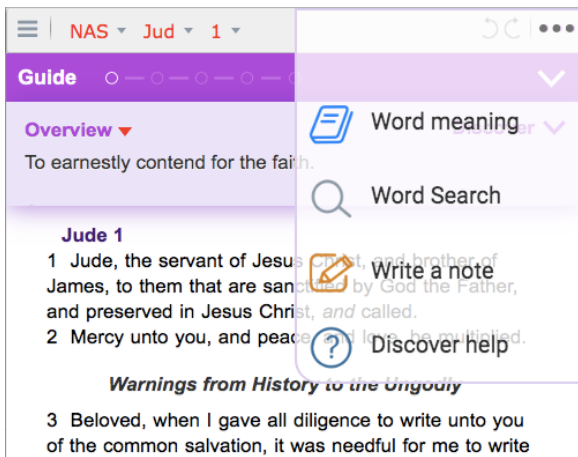
Read asking the who, what, when, where, why and how to glean further insight.

NOTE: GODcha's **cross references** are not exhaustive, but they will help in your understanding.

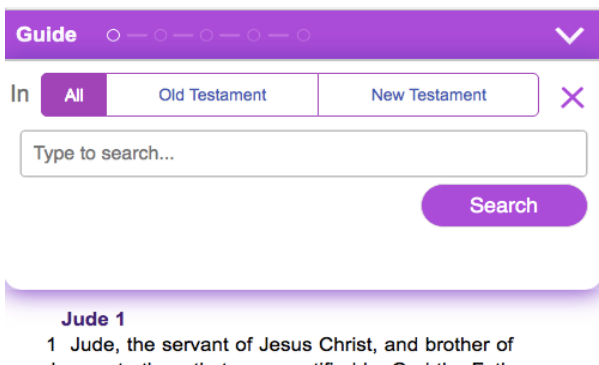
2. In GODcha: The  **Word Search** Tool allows you to search one WORD at a time, **exhaustively!**



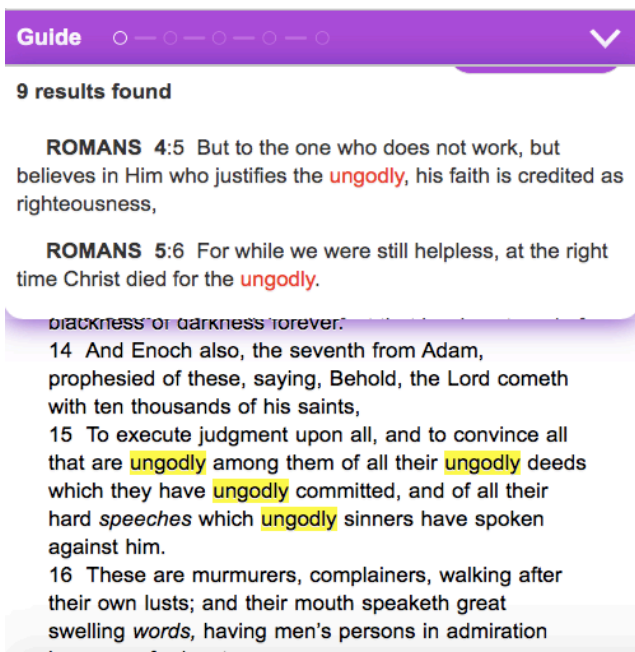
1. Tap on the 3 dots found in the upper right hand corner of the Tool Bar.



2. Tap on Word Search to Open.



3. Type in 'the Word' you are searching. Tap Search.



4. GODcha will bring up **every** Scripture Reference where the Word you are searching is found.

e.g. My Bible was open to the Book of Jude, and I typed '**ungodly**' to search in the NT.

See Results:

- a. GODcha highlighted the **ungodly** in yellow on the page my Bible was opened to – see Jud:15.
- b. GODcha also shows 9 results for the **ungodly**, beginning in Romans.
- c. Read the references asking the who, what,

e.g. I tapped on Romans 4:5 –

My Bible opened to Romans 4:5 with the **ungodly** highlighted in yellow.

6. To close: Scroll up – Tap the X.
